Notice is hereby given that East Hampshire District Council pursuant to an arrangement entered into under Section 19 of the Local Government Act 2000, with the Council of the County of Hampshire, propose to make a permanent Order under the provisions of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which will be to introduce a “prohibition of waiting” on lengths of Chiltlee Manor, Longmoor Road and Victoria Way, a “No waiting between 8.00am and 6.00pm”, on a length of Longmoor Road and a “prohibition of waiting on footways and verges” on a length of Longmoor Road, Liphook.

WAITING ON FOOTWAYS AND VERGES) ORDER 2021

East Hampshire District Council hereby gives notice that pursuant to arrangements made under Section 19 of the Local Government Act 2000 with the Council of the County of Hampshire in exercise of the powers conferred on that County Council under Sections 1 (1), 2 (1), (2) and 4 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (“the 1984 Act”) and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the chief officer of police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act hereby make the following Order:-

1. This Order shall come into operation on the ***** day of ***** 2021 and may be cited as “East Hampshire District Council (Liphook: Chiltlee Manor, Longmoor Road and Victoria Way) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) and (Prohibition of Waiting on Footways and Verges) Order 2021”.

2. (1) In this Order -

"Civil Enforcement Officer" means a person (being a person appointed under Section 76 of the Traffic Management Act 2004 and/or under Section 63A of the 1984 Act) authorised by or on behalf of the Council to supervise any parking place and act as indicated by the use of the expression in any of the Articles in this Order;

"Council" means East Hampshire District Council;

"delivering" and **"collecting"** in relation to any goods includes checking the goods for the purpose of their delivery or collection;

"disabled person's badge" or **"blue badge"** has the same meaning as in The Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000 SI 682;

"Disabled Persons' Parking Place" means an area on a highway which is designated as a disabled persons' parking place and is comprised within and indicated by a road marking complying with the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016;

"disabled person's vehicle" has the same meaning as in The Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England and Wales) Regulations 1986 as amended;

"footway" has the same meaning as in Section 329 of the Highways Act 1980;

“light goods vehicle” means a vehicle, not exceeding 3.5 tonnes gross vehicle weight, which is constructed or adapted for use for the carriage of goods or burden of any description;

“loading” means the loading or unloading of goods to or from a vehicle;

“verge” means any grassed or un-grassed strip of land within any carriageway and forming part of the highway.

- (2) For the purpose of this Order a vehicle shall be regarded as displaying a disabled person's badge or a parking disc in the relevant position when and only when they are displayed in accordance with Regulation 4 of the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000;
 - (3) Except where otherwise stated any reference in this Order to a numbered Article or Schedule is a reference to the Article or Schedule bearing that number in this Order.
3. Save as provided in Article 6 no person shall except upon the direction or with the permission of a police officer in uniform or a Civil Enforcement Officer cause or permit any vehicle to wait in the lengths of roads specified in the First Schedule to this Order.
4. Save as provided in Article 6 no person shall except upon the direction or with the permission of a police officer in uniform or a Civil Enforcement Officer cause or permit any vehicle to wait between the hours of 8.00 a.m. and 6.00 p.m. in the length of road specified in the Second Schedule to this Order.
5. No person shall except upon the direction or with the permission of a police officer in uniform or a Civil Enforcement Officer cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time on any footway or verge in the length of road specified in the Third Schedule to this Order.
6.
 - (1) Subject to the provisions in Article 7 nothing in Articles 3 and 4 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait in the lengths of roads referred to therein for so long as may be necessary to enable -
 - (a) a person to board or alight from the vehicle;
 - (b) the vehicle if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road to be used in connection with any of the following operations namely -
 - (i) building industrial or demolition operations;
 - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;

- (iii) the maintenance improvement or reconstruction of the said lengths of roads; or
 - (iv) the laying erection alteration or repair in or in land adjacent to the said lengths of roads of any sewer or of any main pipe or cable or other apparatus for the provision of gas water electricity or telecommunications by a utility organization attending their apparatus in pursuance of their statutory powers or duties; or
 - (v) in pursuance of a local authority's highways management, works, maintenance, waste collection or street cleansing.
 - (c) the vehicle if it is a Universal Service Provider as defined in Section 4(3) of the Postal Services Act 2000 used for the delivering or collecting of postal packets;
 - (d) the vehicle to take in petrol oil water or air from any garage situated on or adjacent to the said lengths of roads;
 - (e) the vehicle to wait at or near to any premises situated on or adjacent to the said lengths of roads for so long as such waiting by that vehicle is reasonably necessary in connection with any wedding or funeral; or
 - (f) the vehicle if it is being used by the emergency services in pursuance of their statutory powers or duties; or
 - (g) the vehicle if it is required by law to stop or obliged to stop so as to prevent an accident or prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond its control.
 - (h) the vehicle to wait for the purpose of enabling goods to be loaded on or unloaded from the vehicle.
- (2) Nothing in Articles 3 and 4 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle which validly displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge in the circumstances prescribed in Regulations 7, 8 or 9 and subject to the limitation set out in Regulation 6(2) of the Local Authorities Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000 SI 683 to wait in the lengths of roads referred to therein.
7. Those vehicles described in Article 6 (1) (a) to (h) are subject to the provision that:-
- (a) there is no reasonable alternative place to stop or wait; and
 - (b) they only stop and wait for so long as is necessary.

8. The prohibitions and restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restriction or requirement imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act or by or under any other enactment.

FIRST SCHEDULE
(Waiting prohibited at all times)

Lengths of roads in Liphook

Chiltlee Manor	South side: From a point 88 metres south-east of the junction with London Road in a north-easterly direction for a distance of 40 metres.
Longmoor Road	South side:- From the junction with Victoria Way in an easterly direction for a distance of 11 metres.
Victoria Way	West side:- From the junction with Longmoor Road in a southerly direction for a distance of 65 metres. East side:- From the junction with Longmoor Road in a southerly direction for a distance of 58 metres.

SECOND SCHEDULE
(No waiting between the hours of 8.00am and 6.00pm.)

Length of road in Liphook

Longmoor Road	South side:- From a point 11 metres to east of junction with Victoria Way in an easterly direction for a distance of 15 metres.

STATEMENT OF REASONS FOR
PROPOSING TO MAKE THIS ORDER

Notice is hereby given that East Hampshire District Council pursuant to an arrangement entered into under Section 19 of the Local Government Act 2000, with the Council of the County of Hampshire, propose to make a permanent Order under the provisions of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which will be to introduce a “prohibition of waiting” on lengths of Chiltee Manor, Longmoor Road and Victoria Way, a “No waiting between 8.00am and 6.00pm”, on a length of Longmoor Road and a “prohibition of waiting on footways and verges” on a length of Longmoor Road, Liphook.

Longmoor Road is located in the village of Liphook and links the village centre with the A3. It is predominantly rural except for the section within the village which is residential in nature. The properties are generally detached and some have off street parking. There is a terrace of properties near the junction with Victoria Way that does not have off street parking. There is a small nursery school together with the larger secondary school located on the south side of Longmoor Road, fairly close to the junction of Victoria Way and a pedestrian crossing which allows parents and children to cross Longmoor Road. Victoria Way is a cul de sac that is located off Longmoor Road and is relatively new in design. The properties are terraced and located off courtyards with separate parking in garages provided. Chiltee Manor is a road on the eastern side of the village off the B2131.

Complaints have been received about parking around the junction of Victoria Way and Longmoor Road, which takes place at pickup and drop off times and causes problems for both pedestrians and vehicles. School children walk down Victoria Way from the station. A complaint was received about parking taking place on the verge alongside the pedestrian crossing which obstructs vision. In Chiltee Manor a complaint has been received that vehicles are parking on the pavement, obstructing the front door access to the manor building. The front access now needs to be in use to allow for COVID-19 social distancing measures to be put in place in line with Government guidance.

It is proposed to install several lengths of double yellow lines around the junction of Longmoor Road and Victoria Way and to continue these past the first bend in Victoria Way. It is further proposed to install a length of no parking on the verge and footway on Longmoor Road alongside the pedestrian crossing zig zags. Also, to install a length of double yellow line outside Chiltee Manor, to enable the use of the front door access and for pedestrians to walk along the footway unimpeded.

This Order is proposed so as to avoid danger to persons or other traffic using the roads or for preventing the likelihood of any such danger arising, and to facilitate the passage of traffic.

Drawing No's: 2020/LIP0001 & 2020/LIPW002 shows the lengths of roads which are the subject of the proposed Order.

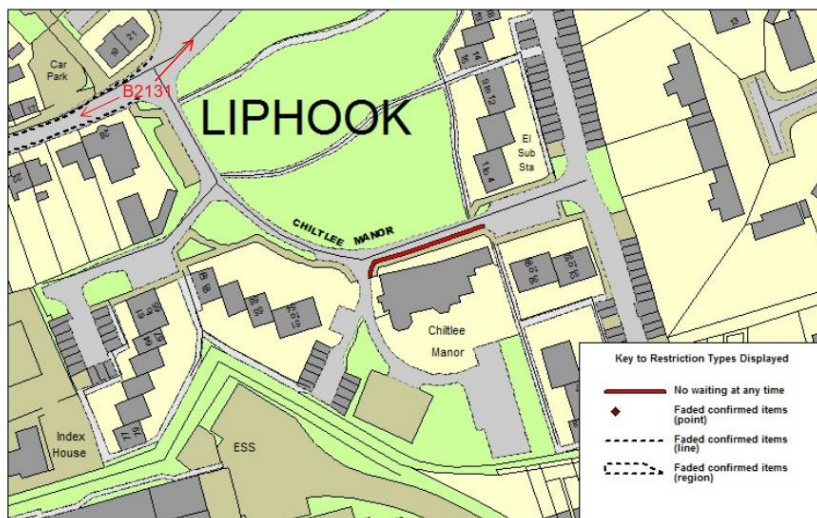
